INTRODUCTION

1. Retired Tri Service Officers and Other Ranks possess a vast experience in their professional fields and are generally recognised as “War Veterans”. In this context, a former member of the Armed Forces of Sri Lanka, (Army, Navy and Air Force) who have served during declared or undeclared operations or on active service attained highest rank and retired under honourable or general conditions are considered as veterans. Reservists who are called for active service by an executive order also come under this category. Wearing a uniform after retirement as described hereunder, is a privilege granted in recognition of the loyal and dedicated service rendered to the country.

2. The retired military personnel of the Tri Services who have obtained the membership of Ex-Servicemen Association (The only organization that is registered and approved by the Ministry of Defence) with regard to the mentioned rules accordingly and invited to national functions, military and non-military events (Schools and other Organizations) are eligible to wear the dresses stipulated in this booklet.





**AUTHORIZED PERSONNEL TO WEAR THE
STIPULATED DRESS CODES**

3. The Retired Officers and Other Ranks of the Tri Services are authorized to wear respective dresses mentioned below:
- a. Retired Service Commanders.
 - b. Retired Flag Rank Officers.
 - c. Retired personnel who are called for active service from the Regular (General) Reserve/Volunteer (General) Reserve to serve in military establishments/Civil establishments.
 - d. Differently abled Ex-Servicemen.
 - e. Officers / Other Ranks Retired with service pension.
 - f. Officers/Other Ranks retired honourably after 10/12 years of enlisted service.
 - g. Officers/ Other Ranks retired on medical grounds. (Officers and Other Ranks who have completed 10-12 years of active service and battle casualties only)
 - h. Officers/ Other Ranks living abroad and those who are in Diplomatic Missions.
 - i. NOK of deceased (Only standard medals can be worn with the civil attire).





AUTHORISED EVENTS

4. Retired Officers and Other Ranks are authorized to wear the stipulated dress codes for following events which are organized and invited by government/ civil and military organizations (Service ID issued by the respective svc to be in his/ her possession).

a. National/ State Functions:

- (1) National Independence Day.
- (2) Victory Day Celebration.
- (3) National War Memorial Day.
- (4) Armed Forces Remembrance Day.
- (5) The Speech of the Throne/ First Parliamentary Sessions.
- (6) State Dinners.
- (7) Diplomatic Missions/ Receptions.
- (8) State Funerals. *





b. Military Functions/ Events:

- (1) Tri Service Anniversary/ Memorial Days.
- (2) Passing Out Parades/ Graduation Ceremonies.
- (3) Consecration/ Re-awarding of Colours Ceremonies.
- (4) Dinner Nights/ Guest Nights.
- (5) Military Weddings.
- (6) Military Funerals.

c. Non Military Functions/Events Organized by Civil Organization:

- (1) Patriotic Parades (Government organized).
- (2) Social events held in honour of Retired Servicemen.
- (3) School events such as Investiture. Ceremonies (School Cadet/Ceremonies Presenting Honours / Prefect Day etc...).





UNAUTHORISED EVENTS AND PERSONNEL

5. Wearing uniforms at below mentioned places and events is prohibited for discharged and retired members of Tri Services:
- a. At any meeting or demonstration which is anti-government in nature.
 - b. During political activities where candidates of political parties display their uniformed pictures in placards and billboards in public/ mass/ social media and prohibited as per the government gazette.
 - c. Private employment or commercial interests, when an inference of official sponsorship for the activity could be drawn.
 - d. When appearing in civil or criminal court.
 - e. Participating in public speeches, interview, picket line, marches or rallies, or any public demonstration which may imply official military sanction.
 - f. Furthering political activities, private employment, or commercial interests.
 - g. Working in an-off- duty civilian capacity.
 - h. Retired Officers and Other Ranks who work in civil institutions/ security services.





STIPULATED DRESS CODES FOR RETIRED OFFICERS AND OTHER RANKS

6. The dress codes stipulated for Officers and Other Ranks of Tri Services are as shown below:

- a. Retired Officers and Other Ranks (Male) – Annex A.
- b. Retired Officers and Other Ranks (Female) – Annex B.

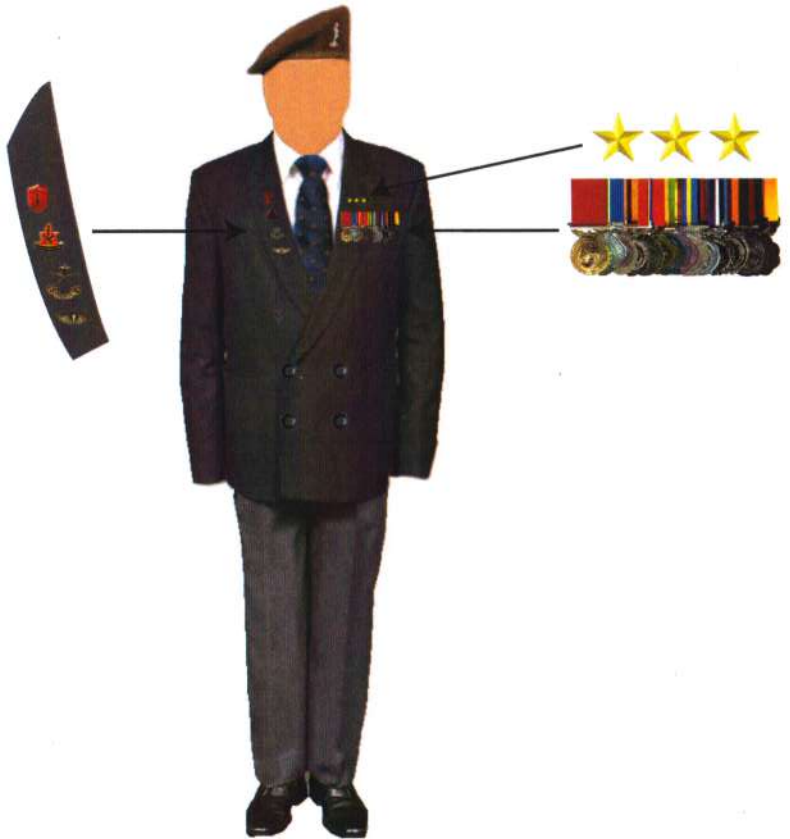
